Rotors, Wings & Wheels Off to a Flying Start

The Fullerton Airport is expanding its offerings to the residents of the city and the surrounding communities.

The Antique Aircraft exhibit has been displaying classic aircraft on the 2nd Sunday of each month for a number of years and will continue with the upcoming event scheduled for Sunday, February 9th.

Joining the monthly event mix is Rotors, Wings and Wheels scheduled for the 1st Saturday of each month. The upcoming event will be held Saturday, February 1st (*unless it rains*). The name of the event was selected to describe the encompassing concept of helicopter and airplane displays, attracting those with an interest in aviation, plus a custom car and motorcycle show.

The January event attracted owners of over 125 cars and more than a dozen motorcycles. The cars were on display along the front of the airport on Commonwealth Ave. Several

exhibitors that I spoke with said they had a good time, and planned to return for the February event. A drawing was held, various prizes were raffled off, and trophies were awarded to a select group of the vehicles on display.

Music from the 50's, a jump house and balloons for the kids went a long way in making it a family affair. A few vendors often seen at the Fullerton Market also participated. While the event is free, helicopter and plane rides on some of the aircraft were available for a fee.

These free monthly events are part of new Airport Manager Brandon O'Reilly's plan to inform the community of all the airport has to offer.

Also, anticipated in May, will be the reopening of the airport restaurant under a new proprietor. The winning bidder for the airport restaurant lease will be announced on January 22nd.
